

You Could Get FREE Hire to Start a New Group

There are introductory packages for new classes and potentially some free hire for some village organisations or groups. Free use of a room can, subject to availability, be by a group or organisation that is established purely for the benefit of the village where the individual members of that group derive no financial or other direct benefits themselves. Any event that requires attendees to pay a fee for attending (e.g. a fundraiser so that the group can spend the proceeds to benefit the village) must be able to show that the entire proceeds (less reasonable costs) benefit the village as a whole.

Free use of a room or hall can also facilitate a meeting to see if a group or organisation can gain sufficient interest to establish itself and become a potential hirer in the longer term. No fee must charged to those attending the meetings, except to the extent required to cover prime costs. Such use to be no more than three meetings.

GET YOUR MONTHLY FICTION FIX AT HOOK BOOKS

With more than 3,000 books to choose from at incredible value, Hook Books is a monthly pop up library of donated second hand books at the Elizabeth Hall. It's every first Thursday of the month from 2-4pm.

There's adult paperback fiction and children's books for all ages. Plus there's tea, coffee and home-made cake baked by Louise of Simple Cakes. It's become a regular social event for the community and the perfect place to pick your next month's reading fix. Adult books are 50p per book and children's books are just 20p each or three for 50p.

Can't make it to Hook Books? We also have good quality hardbacks and paperbacks (fiction and nonfiction) for adults on the Hook Books bookcase at Tesco, Hook where there's a cash only honesty box. Again, it's just 50p per book. For children's books there is a bookcase at both the Elizabeth Hall and the Community Centre.

Hook Books accepts the following book donations:

- good condition paperback fiction
- good condition hardback fiction and biographies
- cookery books
- · children's books

We have had to stop accepting other books, whatever their condition, as the money we get for them has dropped by 60% to just 2p per kilo, which is not worth our volunteers' time to sort them out. You can take your book donations along to the Elizabeth Hall any weekday morning or to the pop-up library (2-4pm, first Thursday of the month). Please don't donate books by taking them to Tesco as this can result in the bookcase overflowing and jeopardise our arrangement with the store.

Hook Books is run solely by volunteers and all proceeds go to support running and improving the Elizabeth Hall.



WE HAVE LIFT OFF

Access to the two upper floor rooms at Hook Community Centre is now much easier for people who have mobility issues as a result of the charity (HVHCA) installing two new lifts – one for each room. The new lifts were installed in the second half of 2024 but work on the "Access For All" project started back in 2023.

The then existing platform lift to the Club Room was dated, unreliable and unpopular with users, plus it blocked the staircase when in use. The chair lift for access to Holt also took up stair space and was unpopular as it required some else to carry a wheelchair up the stairs. Users were then faced with negotiating two doors opening against them and a narrow corridor.

The HVH Board took professional advice from a surveyor and building control and a scheme was devised to instal two dedicated lifts that would free up the stairs and give appropriate, dignified access for all.

In September of 2023, we became aware, via Hook Parish Council, of a potential grant from a government





fund, which allocated £1m for Hart administered by Hart District Council. An application was submitted. After fighting our corner with the help of our district councillors, the initial decision not to give us a grant was changed and we finally received approval for a grant of £55,554 towards the project.

Tenders were sought and a timetable of works drawn up, with the intention of all works being completed by September 2024. Inevitable delays and snagging meant the lifts did not become fully operational until early November 2024, but they are now up (and down) and working.

The total cost of around £132,000 was met by a grant of £55,554 from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and funds and reserves built up by the charity over many years thanks to the Board's

careful financial management.





ELIZABETH HALL IMPROVEMENTS

Following on from the kitchen refurbishment in 2023, further investment in the Elizabeth Hall has seen easier access to tables from Hall 1, additional soundproofing between Halls 1 and 4 and a large extension to the patio, now accessible from new patio doors in Hall 4.

WHO OWNS AND RUNS THE TWO HALLS

Both Hook Community Centre and the Elizabeth Hall are run by a registered charity - Hook Village Halls Charitable Association (HVH). The charity has a board of trustees and three part time staff. All of its income comes from licensees and hirers, with not a penny from your Council Tax. The only exception is IF the Community Centre makes a loss in any year, which it hasn't since 2017, Hook Parish Council underwrites that loss. The same does not apply to the Elizabeth Hall.

The land at the Elizabeth Hall is owned by the charity (freehold). Hook Parish Council owns the building itself and leases it to HVH.

The land and building at the Community Centre is owned by Hook Parish Council, which leases the building and grounds to HVH.

The two buildings are managed to deliver the charity's objects (as set out in it's Memorandum of Association). These are:

(a) To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Hook Parish and within its vicinity for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals including those who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disability,

financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life;

- (b) To advance education and the religious and intellectual development of the members of the community; and
- (c) Such other charitable purposes as the Charity's officers in their discretion shall see fit for such exclusively charitable objects or purposes in any part of the world.

The board of trustees meets ten times a year to oversee the direction and policies of the charity. It also takes decisions over investments in the buildings and major maintenance issues, licence and hire fees and many other matters that are inherent in running two busy buildings.

Currently there are eight trustees and the charity would welcome more. If you are interested in becoming involved, get in touch to find out more. The staff manage the day to day operation of the buildings including lettings and hire management, overseeing contractors and interacting with its many hirers. This magazine shows you just some of the wide variety and sheer quantity of opportunities available to you at the two buildings.


